Smaller classes allow professors to put more time and effort into each individual student allowing for a better learning environment for all.

Therefore, not only do you get more easily distracted, partakeinlittle distracted,partakeinlit to no class discussion, nor are you not always held accountable fo participation in class you are statistically less likely to get that "A" that's going to drive you into your dream job.
