
Waka Flocka Flame \$5 Tickets for Faculty and Staff

Pedro Linares Family Cartoneria Exhibition Through March 10



Lindenwood University is honored to accept and display the collection of 18 sculptures by noted Mexican folk artist Pedro Linares and his family from the Laumeier Sculpture Park. The Sculpture Park has owned the collection since 1990 and last exhibited it in 1992, the year of Linare's death.

The exhibit runs through March 10, 2019 in the Boyle Family Gallery in the J. Scheidegger Center for the Arts. There is an opening reception on Thursday, Jan. 31 from 6-8 p.m. and a Gallery Talk at 7 p.m. by Dana Turkovic,

curator, Laumeier Sculpture Park, St. Louis, Missouri. The opening reception and Gallery Talk are free and open to the public.

Pedro Linares (b. 1906) came into prominence as an artist in his native Mexico City through his mastery of cartoneria (papier-mache sculpture) and his invention of alebrijes (fantastical creatures) in the 1930's. Linares received the **Mexican Government's National Award for Science and Art** in 1990. His three sons, Miguel, Enrique, and Felipe learned the craft and worked alongside him as a

team on the sculptures: almost all the sculptures are collaborative. Now, three of his grandsons are carrying on the tradition.

The sculptures in this collection date from around 1990 and are in the **EI Dia de los Muertos** (Day of the Dead) tradition, one of the genres for which the Linares Family is most known. In these vingettes, skeletons are depicted in everyday occupations such as newsboy, musician, and cowboy.
