

A Long Labor of Love: Long River



Today is Chinese New Year, a fitting time to share about *Long River*, a translation of selected poems by contemporary Chinese poet Yang Jian. A long labor of love, the collaborative translation process was led by Ye Chun (assistant professor, Providence College, English) and Gillian Parrish (assistant professor, Lindenwood University, MFA in Writing program). In addition to word by word and line by line edits (over many years, filling many binders!), Parrish led in distilling the manuscript from 200 pages to 100 pages, culling and arranging the poems, so that the book presents "the best wor[ks] in the best order" (to misquote Coleridge). Parrish also wrote the book's

introductory essay on Yang Jian's elegiac, ecopoetic vision of China's fast-changing land and culture.

Lindenwood Learning Academy- Grand Opening




