## **Service Outages**

On Monday, March 11, 2019, there will be two utility outages on the St. Charles campus:

#### **Electricity**

Beginning at 5 a.m., electricity will be shut down in eight residence halls--(Blanton, Rauch, Calvert Rogers, Guffey, Flowers, Mathews, Reynolds, and Pfremmer halls), the Spellmann Center, the J. Scheidegger Center, the Field House, the Fitness Center, Evans Commons, Hyland Arena, and the Welcome Center--to complete replacement of a transformer. During the outage, there will be no lighting and limited hot water. Elevators in these buildings should not be utilized after 4:30 a.m.

There will be no food service in Spellmann. In Evans Commons, food service will follow the established spring-break schedule with the first meal (lunch) beginning at 11 a.m. Questions regarding food service should be directed to Nancy Tinker at NTinker@lindenwood.edu.

The primary data center will be fully operational as it is powered by generator and uninterrupted power supply. All application services will be operational from internet-connected devices. Please note that Wi-Fi, wired network, and phone services will be unavailable in buildings impacted by the outage. In preparation for the electrical outage, please power off all IT equipment (computers, monitors, and printers) prior to the outage. All classroom and AV installations in effected buildings will be shut down by IT personnel prior to the outage.

#### <u>Water</u>

Beginning at 5 a.m., water will be turned off in Evans Commons and the Hyland Arena to complete a water line repair. Neither hot nor cold water will be available during the outage.

Each impacted area should take proactive measures to minimize disruption from these outages. It is difficult to determine the length of time needed for repairs, but it is estimated that both outages will end at 9 a.m.

Legislative Affairs for the St Louis Metropolitan Medical Society, so drew on his experience.



# **Assessment Tip of the Week**

The provost recently made you aware of an <a href="IPEDS report">IPEDS report</a> (February 1, 2019

Digest) comparing Lindenwood to a group of Midwestern private universities. This additional <a href="comparison data set">comparison data set</a> (Comparison Data, 2019 - you can find it on the

<u>Assessment Website</u> in the <u>Institutional Data & Surveys section</u>) expands upon that report. You will see Lindenwood compared to a number of other institutions across a wide range of variables. You will find eight different comparison groups:

- 1. Conference schools (Great Lakes Valley Conference)
- 2. St. Louis region schools
- 3. Competitors
- 4. Top 10 US News & World Report Midwest Regional Universities (2019 edition)
- 5. Other Missouri private schools
- 6. Other Midwestern schools
- 7. Primary comparison group
- 8. Doctoral/Professional Universities (Carnegie Classification) in Missouri and Illinois

#### You will find schools compared on:

- Academics (e.g., student to faculty ratio)
- Admissions (e.g., total enrollment)
- Athletics affiliation (e.g., NCAA Division II)
- Campus setting (e.g., City: Small)
- Carnegie classification (e.g., Doctoral/Professional Universities)
- Financial factors (e.g., tuition and fees)
- Retention and graduation rates (e.g., freshman to sophomore retention rate)
- Student characteristics (e.g., undergraduate race/ethnicity)
- U.S. News Ranking Indicators (e.g., peer assessment score)

All data were collected from IPEDS (the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System) with the exception of cohort default rates (collected from the U.S. Department of Education), terminal degree percentages and total endowment numbers (collected from U.S News and World Report), and Carnegie Classifications (collected from the Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education.) The U.S. News Ranking Indicators came from the most recent edition (2019) of the U.S. News and World Report College Rankings.

Please note some things that are new or different about this 2019 comparison study compared to the 2018 version (which you can find on the <u>Assessment Website</u> in the <u>Institutional Data & Surveys section</u>):

- The "conference schools" comparison group is now the Great Lakes Valley Conference schools, including Lindenwood and Southwest Baptist (both new conference members in 2019-20).
- There is now a comparison group of "**Doctoral/Professional Universities**" (those in Missouri and Illinois), Lindenwood's new Carnegie Classification.
- The "Top 10 schools in US News and World Report Midwest Regional Universities" are almost the same in this 2019 edition except that North Central

College has been replaced by the Milwaukee School of Engineering in the #10 spot.

- Last year's "other regional schools" has simply been relabeled as "**other Midwestern schools**."
- Another new comparison group has been added: Lindenwood's "**primary comparison group**," consisting of Bradley, Butler, Creighton, Drake, Drury, Lewis, Maryville, U. of Indianapolis, Webster, and Xavier.
- For ease of interpretation, **median values** have been added for each variable within each comparison group. The only exception to that is the US News Ranking Indicators.

Note: the list of "competitors" has not changed from last year; the list was provided by Terry Whittum, Vice President for Enrollment Management, and represents competitors relative to the St. Charles campus (traditional programs), based on ACT overlap (that is, a school is on the list because it is one of the schools for which students commonly sent their ACT scores to both Lindenwood and the "competitor school"). Community colleges are among Lindenwood's competitors but those schools were not included in the "competitors" group for purposes of this comparison study.

As the provost noted earlier, such comparison data offer insights into areas in which we compare favorably as well as areas of focus for improvement.


