UNITED WAY CAMPAIGN BEGINS .

President Spainhower is sending a personal letter to all faculty and staff members, asking for their help in Lindenwood's United Way Campaign. Goals of 100 percent participation and \$2,500 in tax-deductible contributions are being sought from the college's 275 full and part-time employees. This year's campaign, which begins this week and runs until October 15, is under the direction of Lynne Landholt, assistant director of development for the annual fund.

Last year, Lindenwood employees contributed nerly \$2,200 to the United Way Locally, the college's contributions were part of nearly \$440,000 Campaign. raised in St. Charles County. From those contributions, nearly a dozen service organizations in the county received \$1.4 million from the \$32 million collected

in the 1985 fund-raising campaign.

As part of this year's campaign, a 9-minute film will be available for individual showings on September 24 between 11 a.m. and 1 p.m. in Ayres Cafeteria. You are encouraged to take a few minutes from your lunches, schedules and classes to view this United Way film for a better understanding of how the United Way of Greater St. Louis helps within our community.

'LINDENWOOD CAMPUS DIET'

Lindenwood is first in the metro area to offer a new diet designed by Jane Henthorn, R.N., director of the Campus Health Center, and Pat Perotti, a registered dietician and former faculty member at St. Louis Community College at Florissant Valley. Called the "Lindenwood Campus Diet," the program consists of a 1,250 calorie per day plan utilizing meals at Ayres Cafeteria. It follows guidelines established by the American Heart and American Diabetes associations. Presently, the diet is for females only, however, a diet for men as well as a 1,500 and a 2,400 calorie per day plan are in the works. Henthorn and Perotti developed the diet in response to a Food Service Committee survey last year which reported 25% of the repsondents were interested in losing weight.
