Sadiqa Reza, a student in the Master's in Behavior Analysis program recently completed innovative research on teaching procedures for early learners with disabilities, with supervision from adjunct instructor Dr. Pavone. Reza's research looks at how to teach sitting and attending skills without the use of forced compliance. Her creative approach to using the least restrictive environment to teach these children is evidence of her strong clinical expertise and pragmatic approach to the science of human behavior. Reza's and Pavone's work has been selected for presentation at the International Association for Behavior Analysis annual conference in May 2019. 


educational resources have saved students across the country millions of dollars. But, what are open educational resources? What other benefits have faculty and students seen with the adoption of open educational resources?

Assessment Tip of the Week

Closing the Loop: ADP Continuous Improvement of Program Assessments (April 12, 2019)

Closing the loop in assessments may also be a process of continuous improvement when we work toward growth/improvement goals. Although continuous improvement may call for modifications of assessment plans, there are adaptively structural directions for us to maintain as best practices for quality assurance.

The School of Accelerated Degree Programs (ADP) is a miniature Lindenwood consisting of several degree programs. Most of them, though similar to those on the main campus in St. Charles, are autonomous in designing their curricula and assessment plans. The consolidations of similar programs in the period of Fall 2019 semester will be likely to have different stories to tell.

For the eras of ADP 2.0 which will end mostly on June 30, 2019, this Assessment Tip focuses on effective written communication, a common learning outcome across ADP degree programs. Although our assessment results indicated that students met the outcome measures even after we raised the bar in the past few years, "papers (were) still not at the level desired" as a program director reported.

The 2018 annual assessment report from the Health Management (HM) program shared the following. "Program Director has attended a writing workshop offered by the LU Writing Center and adjunct faculty were given a presentation at the 8/11/2018 Adjunct Faculty Conference. ... Efforts are on-going to develop a standard rubric for Health Management." Coordinating resourceful help from the Writing Center is also prominent in the program Canvas courses. The program director will share this continuous improvement in the next program assessment report.

The ADP Business Administration programs revised their standardized rubrics to capture better evaluations of student performances in written and oral communication in business areas and in their ability to recommend business solutions to complex problems. The main purpose is to assist their adjuncts in meeting our meaningful evaluation guidelines so that programs have better assessment results to use for future development of curricula for higher order learning. The revised standardized rubrics were implemented in the Fall QTR 17 term. Their 2018 annual program assessment reports shared the following. "Grades continued to be high, though showing signs of improvement after implementing our revised rubric. ... Other future strategic plans may include training our instructors to provide better effective feedback."

The ADP-MBA courses in economics and finance rolled out an assignment dividing a course term-paper assignment into steps for completing the paper.

Students reflect on their work and progress of each step on subsequent weeks progressing ahead of the term paper due date. The course instructor shares feedback for improvement. Survey of instructors and students revealed unaligned perceptions of the level of improvement in the areas of effective communication in business, research and analytical skills, and project management. Further communication on these aligned expectations are ongoing. Students and instructors are aligned on improvements in these areas: Research agenda, self-evaluation, research interests, applications of subject matters, higher order thinking, ability to reach the bottom line, and paper originality.

While these closing the loop activities are ongoing, these ADP programs have their end-goals in mind as directions for their continuous improvement. Questions? Contact Areerat Kichkha at AKichkha@lindenwood.edu or x2946.
