For full-time students, early registration continues through Friday from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. in Roemer Hall. Seniors registered yesterday while juniors register today, sophomores on Wednesday, freshmen on Thursday and anyone on Friday. "If you fail to register at the appropriate time without giving notice of withdrawal from the college, you will forfeit your \$250 deposit," states Registrar Sally Sears.

'IMAGERY IN COLOR' OPENS . . .

"Imagery in Color," an exhibit featuring works by Fire and Jorge Cruzent, is open now through December 12 in the Hendren Gallery of the FAB. "A unique feature of the exhibit is that the husband and wife team has collaborated on many of the works," said Dean Eckert, chairman of the Art Dept. "Jorge Cruzent provides linear designs for the compositions while Fire Cruzent devises the color schemes which she executes in gouache, an opaque watercolor medium. These figurative compositions display vivid color and a rich sense of decorative pattern," he said. The exhibit also includes line drawings, wall hangings and intricate collages.
