CAB Ops Volunteers Needed - April 25

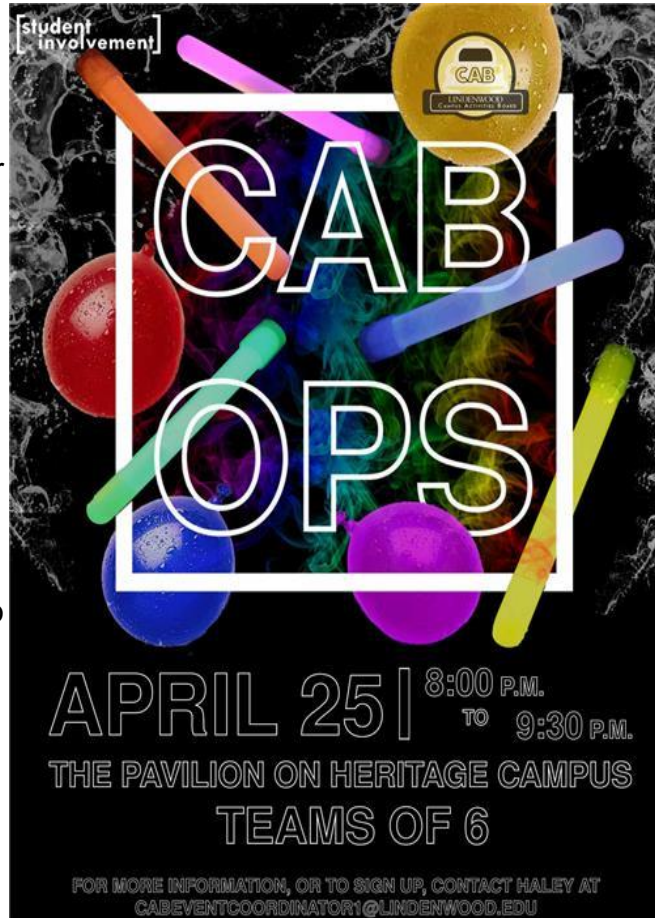
If you have great relationships with students or desire to gain great relationships with students, Campus Activities Board has an opportunity specifically designed for you to achieve and retain this!

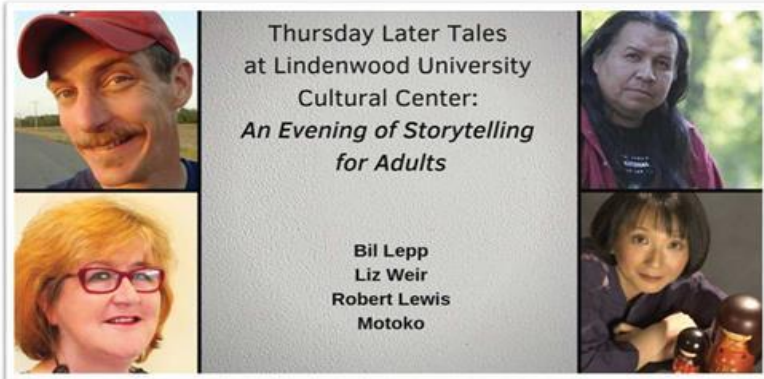
