You May be Eligible for Compensation Through The Faculty **Student Scholarship Committee**

Faculty members who teach a course whose primary purpose is to engage in undergraduate research with a student maybe eligible for compensation through the Faculty Student Scholarship Committee. In order to qualify your course as a research course, it needs to include the following components: collaboration between student and faculty, grade received for work, originality, level 30000 or above, scalable benchmarks, and some form of presentation or accessibility to the larger campus community. Faculty receive 0.20 hours of deployment, or \$300 per student in such courses.
