SOCCER TEAM MAKES ALL-SPORTS COMPETITION . . .

The Lady Lions Soccer Team is among the nation's top 20 teams in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics/Sports Information Directors Association (NAIA/SIDA) Sports Competition. Established in 1969, the program measures the success of an institution's overall athletics programs by the accumulation of points in post-season competition on the district, area and national levels. The Lady Lions, which finished fourth in the nation in NAIA competition, got 25 out of 50 points in the NAIA/SIDA competition. Under the direction of Coach Debbie Kehm, the women's team had its most impressive soccer season in college history.
