LINDENWOOD COED CHOSEN FOR NASA PROGRAM . . .

Bonnie N. Carpenter, a junior at Lindenwood, is among 36 students in the United States chosen to participate in the National Aeronautics & Space Administration (NASA) 1987 Space Training Program. Designed for future astronauts, the six-week training program will be held this summer at the Kennedy Space Center near Cape Canaveral, FL. Majoring in math at Lindenwood in a cooperative five-year program with Washington University, Carpenter plans to be an astronaut/scientist following graduation, hoping to fly in space one day. "The summer program is a stepping stone toward that goal," said John Bornmann, professor and chairman of chemistry.

FACULTY LECTURESHIP SET APRIL 12 . . .

"Education in the Age of Information" is the title of Jean Fields' lecture Sunday afternoon as part of the "Year of the Professor" recognition. Fields, associate professor of communications and English, will give the talk at 2 p.m. Sunday in Sibley Hall Chapel; it is open to all. Her selection for the Faculty Lectureship reestablishes a popular community of the 1970s. The presentation by Fields, a member of the faculty since 1965, will be published in its entirety in an upcoming issue of the LINDEN WORD. Following the lecture, a reception will be held in the newly-dedicated Faculty Lounge on the first floor of Sibley. The "Year of the Professor" focuses attention on Lindenwood faculty members and the important role they play in quality liberal arts instruction.

HANNEGAN RECEIVES SIBLEY AWARD . . .

John C. Hannegan, a partner in the law firm of Thompson & Mitchell in St. Charles and a member of the board of directors, is the recipient of Lindenwood's "Sibley Medallion of Honor," an annual award to honor a community leader whose dedication and support to the college have created a strong bond between the institution and the community.

Cited during a special dinner and recognition April 3, Hannegan was chosen for the award for his leadership and support of Lindenwood as a board member. Currently serving his third three-year term on the board, he is secretary of the 28-member governing body.

Hendren Gallery. Most of the photos were taken during his sabbatical last year to a tropical rain forest in Ecuador and to European cities of Florence, Luxembourg, Paris, Rome, Venice and Vienna. Entitled "Sabbatical Notations," the exhibit can be viewed from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily and from 1-5 on weekends. A member of the faculty since 1980, Levi has another exhibit displayed now through April 26 at the Curved Wall Gallery at Stephens College in Columbia. It features his explorations into the eccentric vision capabilities of the Widelux Slit Camera.

SENIOR NOMINATED FOR AFSL SCHOLARSHIP . . .

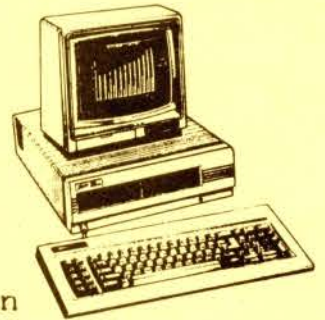
