### SERVICES HELD FOR MARY E. YONKER . . .

Services were held April 18 at St. Charles Presbyterian Church for Mary E. Yonker, former assistant to the president, who died April 16 of an apparent heart attack at the age of 69. Miss Yonker retired in 1982 after 34 years of service to Lindenwood. Following graduation from Washington University in 1939, she joined Lindenwood in 1947 as secretary to President Franc McCluer. During her lengthy career, she served four presidents - two administrations under McCluer, one under John A. Brown, another under William C. Spencer and one under Robert Johns. Her secretary title was changed to that of executive assistant to the president in 1980 and, in 1982, she received an honorary degree from Lindenwood for her nearly 35 years of service.

Miss Yonker is survived by her mother, Blanche Yonker of St. Charles, and a sister, Mrs. Katherine Gill of Princeton, NJ. Memorial contributions in her name may be made to St. Charles Presbyterian Church.
