A MESSAGE FROM THE FOOD SERVICE COMMITTEE:

Have leftover punches on your meal card at the end of the week? Now you can use them at the Snack Bar in the Tea Hole. From 5:30-11 p.m. Monday through Thursday, you can go to the SnackBar and redeem your unused meal-card punches. Stipulations are (1) you must use punches from the present week only (not the one preceding or the week to come), (2) lunch punches will allow you to buy a sandwich and drink (soda or milk), and (3) dinner punches will allow you to buy a sandwich, chips and a drink (soda, milk or shake). Sandwiches will not be the Landshire brand, but ones made in the cafeteria and sold at the SnackBar. No other school in the area allows such an arrangement, so show your support of this idea and take advantage. If the plan is not used, it will be discontinued.

Assistant coach at UMSL since 1984, he also has served as defensive coordinator at Parkway South and is credited with starting the girls basketball program at all levels. He also has served as an assistant football coach at Washington University and Ritnour High School, as head coach at Kennedy High School and as Base Athletic Director for children and military personnel at the U.S. Coast Guard base in Governors Island, NY, from 1970-74. A 1976 graduate of UMSL, he holds an M.A. degree in educational processes from Maryville College. Married and the father of a 3-year-old son, Harris begins the position immediately, replacing former women's Coach Bill Shapiro.
