CONGRATULATIONS - WE MADE IT!

Perhaps you've seen some congratulatory balloons floating around the campus in recent days. Pat yourself on the back because the "Project \$1 Million" exceeded its fiscal 1986-87 funding goal! The fiscal year ended on June 30 with a total of \$1,013,492 in cash and contributions from Lindenwood alumni, college boards, faculty and staff, corporations, St. charles constituencies and other friends. This is the first time the college ever has raised \$1 million for its annual funds drive during a fiscal year!

PHONE-A-THON CONTINUES . .

The Annual Alumni Phone-A-Thon will continue for several more months although the initial fund-raising goal has been met. "We generally call from February through September, depending upon how many alumni we have yet to reach," said Chris Campbell, marketing operations coordinator in the Development Office.

These callers have helped to raise more than \$140,000 in alumni pledges!

Thomas L. Gossage, senior vice-president of Monsanto Chemical Co., and Walter L. Metcalfe, Jr., an attorney with Bryan, Cave, McPheeters & McRoberts in St. Louis, have been elected vice-chairmen of the Lindenwood College Board of Directors. Chaired by Robert F. Hyland, senior vice-president of the CBS Radio Division and general manager of KMOX-AM and KHTR-FM, the 30-member board oversees the management and operation of the college. Gossage, who also serves as Development Chairman of the board, has been a member since 1983, while Metcalfe has served Lindenwood since 1969.

CHAIR NAMED FOR PERFORMING ARTS . . .

Daniel W. Alkofer of Madison, WI, a former university professor, has been named chairperson of the Performing Arts Dept., effective July 15. For the past year, he has served as production and design consultant for the Showroom of the Concourse Dinner Theatre in Madison. From 1981-85, he was associate professor of directing, acting and theatre at Oklahoma State University (OSU) and, from 1969-81, was an assistant and associate professor at Idaho State University, where he also served as Business Manager of Theatre and Auditorium Manager. At OSU, he was chairperson of the Dept. of Theatre at the Stillwater campus from 1981-84.

Alkofer has more than 20 years of stage direction experience in addition to post-graduate lighting design, acting and narration. A 1962 graduate of Oberlin College in Ohio, he has a graduate degree in dramatic art, awarded by the University of Iowa, and a doctorate degree in theatre, awarded by Indiana University.

KRACKE TO DIRECT OFF-CAMPUS CENTERS .

Maggie Kracke, former Lindenwood admissions counselor and corporate recruiter, has been named Director of Off-Campus Centers. Kracke served in the college's Placement Office for a few months before being named director of the Lake St. Louis facility in 1981. Two years later, she joined the admissions staff on the St. Charles campus, a position she held until 1986 when she joined St. Mary's College in O'Fallon as Director of Marketing & Business. Kracke, who holds both undergraduate and graduate degrees in business administration from Lindenwood, will direct both the Mansion House and West Port offices.

PRESIDENT NAMED TEMPORARY SCCCE CHAIRMAN . .

President Janes I. Spainhower will serve as temporary chairman of the newlyformed St. Charles County Conference on Education (SCCCE), an organization that will address the total educational concerns of the county. Membership includes superintendents of all of the county's public school districts, representatives of private elementary and secondary schools and presidents of Lindenwood, St. Mary's and St. Charles County Community colleges.

"There is a strong feeling among St. Charles County educators," Spainhower said, "that educators and the institutions they represent must be organized sufficiently on a county-wide basis to assure the continuation of quality educational opportunities for all areas of St. Charles County." Establishment of the SCCCE is viewed as a viable means of helping the county as a whole address its growing educational needs in a unified manner, he added. The group will meet September 30 to set goals, adopt bylaws and formalize purposes.
