## COCA-COLA CLASSIC SET SEPTEMBER 25-26

The Coca-Cola Bottling Co. of St. Louis, Inc., has teamed with Lindenwood soccer to present the Lindenwood Coca-Cola Classic September 25-26 at the stadium. The two-day tourney will feature the Lindenwood men's and women's teams competing against teams from Missouri Baptist College, Missouri Valley College and Tarkio College. A first-place trophy for both men and women and MVP awards will be provided by Coke.

Friday's schedule will feature men's teams of Lindenwood and Missouri Baptist in a 3 p.m. contest, followed by the women's teams of Missouri Valley and Missouri Baptist in a 5 p.m. game. Men's teams of Tarkio and Missouri Valley compete at 7 p.m., followed by Lindenwood and Tarko women's teams at 9 p.m. Saturday's schedule will feature a consolation game at 11 a.m., followed by the men's teams of Missouri Baptist and Missouri Valley at 1 p.m., the championship game at 3 p.m. and a men's match between Lindenwood and Tarkio at 5 p.m. Admission is free to all Lindenwood students with an I.D.; for others, it's \$1 for students and \$2 for adults.
