COLLEGE FACULTY, STAFF CAMPAIGN BEGINS

Lindenwood's Faculty/Staff Campaign is underway with a \$20,000 goal as part of the college's efforts to secure \$1 million in cash and contributions during the 1987-88 fiscal year. Last year, 46% of the staff and faculty donated about \$20,000 to aid the college in recording its most successful fund-raising campaign in a fiscal year. KSDK'S KATHY LEONARD RECEIVES NOONDAY AWARD

Kathy Leonard, general assignment reporter for KSDK-TV, is the recipient of the first Noonday Award for professional accomplishment in the St. Louis area. Presented recently by the Lindenwood-St. Louis Metropolitan Noonday Group during ceremonies at the Media Club, the award cites Leonard and her 15 years in the broadcasting profession. Composed of St. Louis area business professionals who are Lindenwood alumni, the Noonday Group meets quarterly to promote networking for its members and the college.

A 1972 alumna of Lindenwood, Leonard has been with KSDK's "Eyewitness News" team since 1981. As a student, she worked as an on-air anchorperson and news director for KCLC Radio and, after graduation, joined KMOX-AM Radio as a reporter. She moved to KSD-FM Radio in 1973 and, in 1976, won the Missouri Broadcasters Association's First-Place Award for her special reporter on a "Stop Smoking Clinic."
