## Letter from Thomas Mather to George Sibley, August 25, 1829

Dear Sir,

I recd. Your favor some time since requesting a copy of the account forwarded to Washington for settlement. I send you a copy of a letter I have just received form the 2<sup>nd</sup> candidate by which it appears our accounts are not closed. If it should be necessary to furnish the workers, as it appears from this letter it with. I presume all we have, many he found at Tracey & Wahrendorff, I was much surprised at the receipt of the letter, as I had suppose, the accounts were all passed as a matter of course.
