CIC & TEP Tuition Benefits Seminar



Philosophy and Religion Program Combine

The previous PHL and REL course prefixes have been replaced by a PHRL prefix. If you are looking to enroll students in any philosophy or religion courses, look at PHRL course listings. (If you search for PHL or REL, you will find only a few courses offered at Belleville.) Aside from changes to prefix, course numbers, and minor changes to titles or descriptions (for instance, "Introduction to Philosophy" is now "The Examined Life"), these courses remain the same with all their previous General Education designations.


