# **Workday Outage Timeframe**

Monday, October 8, 2018 at 6 p.m. – Tuesday, October 9, 2018 at 6 a.m.

Workday will be unavailable beginning October 8, 2018 at 5 p.m. to complete the implementation of Workday Curriculum. **During the outage timeframe, all features of the Workday system, including time tracking, will be unavailable via all Internet browsers and the mobile app.** 

Access to all other IT services, including the website, network, wifi, Canvas, CAMS, the portals and email will be unaffected by this outage. The update to Workday will be completed by Tuesday, October 9, 2018 at 8 a.m. Employees that will be working during the outage window will need to track their time manually and those hours will need to be entered into the Workday system by their manager when Workday is back in service.

We are sorry for the disruption in service during this implementation of the next feature in Workday.

# Whistling Vivaldi Book Discussion


