CHANGES/EMPLOYEE HANDBOOK

The following replaces the three paragraphs on page 6 under the heading of HOSPITALIZATION, MEDICAL CARE

Full-time employees are eligible to participate in the College-sponsored health program. This may consist of a health insurance indemnity plan, or a College-sponsored independent health maintenance organization, or a staff health maintenance organization.

Under the health insurance program, employees currently have the option of choosing In-Network or Out-of-Network. An HMO is different in that it provides members with a comprehensive package of service that emphasizes preventive care. HMO members must receive all of their health care from the doctors, hospitals, and providers associated with HMO. Special arrangements exist for treatment of emergencies away from HMO facilities, primary care doctor, etc.

Programs and premiums vary by carrier. The College will participate in the premium payments with monthly contribution, for any of the coverage options of \$50.00 for individual coverage and \$125.00 for family coverage. These contributions apply only for the College sponsored health insurance program, please contact the Personnel Office.

The following replaces the paragraph on page 6 under the heading of RETIREMENT PROGRAMS.

The normal retirement age at Lindenwood is 65 years of age. Employees who retire on their 65th birthday will receive full benefits as provided by the plan. With the approval of the College, an employee may retire before age 65 and receive a reduced amount of monthly retirement benefits based on the total benefits accrued. Faculty and staff may elect to continue as long as the employee continues to contribute to the retirement plan. Other normal benefits in which the employee participates, and Social Security, will continue until retirement (also, see "TIAA-CREF").

Please make the following change on page 7 under heading TIAA-CREF.

Delete the second sentence -- "Benefits begin at retirement age 65".
