Dr. Sir,

I have just met with Mr. Lovejoy, by whom I send you a bill on the Bank of Virginia for \$100 notes on this bank is at a $\frac{1}{2}$ percent discount here notwithstanding I presume it will be at par where you are going. Should there be any loss it will be mine. Tho I anticipate none or else I would procure U. States paper, at this moment I have not the time to do so.

I am sorry that I have not my papers here to send with this so favorable an opportunity if no safe private conveyance offers I will enclose them by Sundays mail. I have not yet obtained Carsons vouchers. I fear I will not be able to do so. If not I will try to procure and forward to you at Washington. 'tis not my fault it has not been obtained.
