Safety Request


All employees will be asked by their supervisors to provide their mobile phone number in Workday. This is necessary to meet the requirements of the crisis management plans of the university.

Updating Contact Information in Workday.


1. Click on the **Personal Information** Worklet.




2. In the <u>Personal Information</u> Worklet, click on the change "Contact Information"

Hunt Ferrarini to Present Webinar on North and South Korea



Dr. Tawni Hunt Ferrarini will present a webinar, "Why Do Some Nations Prosper? The Case of North and South Korea," on Aug. 21 from 6-7 p.m.

Economists have debated for years why it is that some nations prosper while others do not. The Democratic People's Republic of Korea (North Korea, DPRK) and the Republic of Korea (South Korea, ROK), for example, started out as poor nations after World War II. Now, South Korea has the same wealth as Western European nations, on average, yet North Korea firmly remains at the bottom of the world's development ladder. This

webinar will explore and explain why institutions matter and are fundamental to economic success.

Panagos and Hantak Present in Athens, Greece



Dr. Rebecca Panagos and Dr. Kelly Hantak presented at the University of Athens, Greece on June 21 at the Twenty-fifth International Conference on Learning.

The conference theme focused on "Education in a Time of Austerity and Social Turbulence" and Rebecca and Kelly presented "Underpaid and Undereducated: How to Raise the Profession of Early Childhood." As members of public policy forum in the National Association for the Education of the Young Child and the National Standards Workgroup for the Division for Early Childhood in the Council for Exceptional Children, Rebecca and Kelly shared the latest initiatives developed from the public policy forums.

Initiatives addressed included decreasing gaps in pay disparity of daycare, preschool, and K-12 teachers; increasing workforce skills; adding levels of certification from high school, child development associate, associate degree; and tax credit incentives for higher education. Audience discussion related interest in application of the initiatives in their home countries. Higher education faculty from universities in Australia, New Zealand, China, India and the United States attended the session.
