
TENNIS

INDEPENDENT ACCOUNTANTS SOCIETY OF MISSOURI

Independent Accounts Society of Missouri will award two scholarships of \$500 and one scholarship of \$100 for the academic year 1988-89 to students majoring in accounting with a "B" or better average in the remainder of their courses.
