

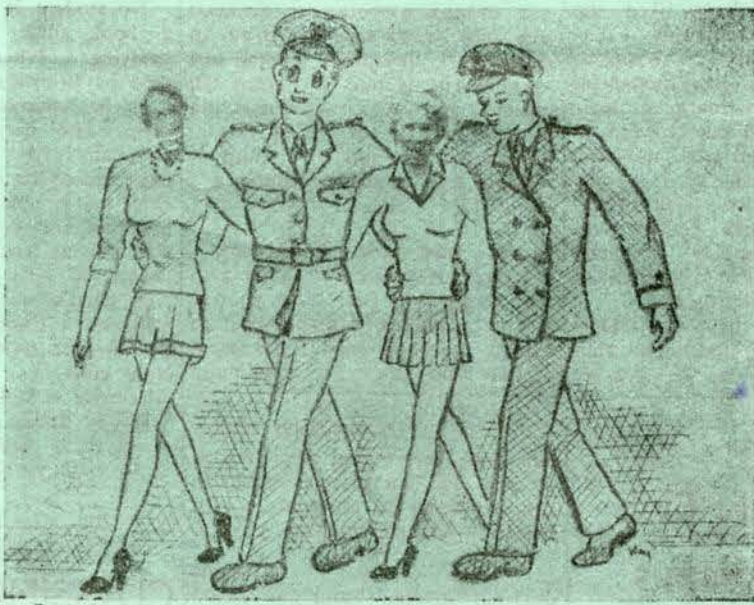

Mass Man Meeting On L. C.

Campus April 3 & 4

A conference has been called by Lindenwood to discuss the most vital problem of the police action! ??? — the shortage of men. Lindenwood women realize how crucial this may be, and they are not going to sit back calmly and do without the boys.

The conference dates have been set for April 3 and 4. Delegates from the faculties and student bodies of all the nearby women's colleges will meet on Lindenwood's campus. Plans for the conference include panels, lectures, field trips, and courses of study, as well as the usual dances and parties.

Student panel topics will be: "Techniques of Picking Up Dates" led by Janey Noel; "Entertaining the Boys in Uniform" led by Penny Todsén; "Hooking the Boys left at Home and Liking It" led by Paula Moore. All the student leaders are experts on the subjects mentioned.

Among the projects of the conference are field trips to Scott Field and Fort Leonard Wood, where the most educational events will be dances for the soldiers and girls.

New Chapel Built During Vacation Students Will Wear Jeans Or Shorts To Unveiling May 2

The new chapel will be razed during spring vacation. Bullet and Ted G. said today in a joint announcement to the student body. It is to be known as the Belding Chapel.

The building, to be constructed of neolite and paper bricks, with lucite windows will measure 6 ft. by 2860 ft. It will take 3 days to construct. (Dr. Gill said the unusual length of the room would enable speakers to test their voices, and the width is expected to eliminate before-Chapel whispering.) The floor is constructed of Timmons inner-sprung mattresses to further aid in stopping noise, and faculty members will be asked to check their mail at the door.

The new chapel will have a

basement, a sub-basement and a sub-sub-basement, to be used for the overflow on special occasions such as the Senior chapel talks. These rooms will be equipped with TV . . . a direct line from the main auditorium . . . and Miss Boyer's production classes will take care of the camera work etc., involved. (The school's three cameras will be used, and will be under the close supervision of Bob C. at all times.) New microphones will be installed.
