Water to be Shut Off to Heritage Buildings Monday, Aug. 6

There will be one final shut down of water to the Heritage side of campus on **Monday**, **August 6, 2018**. The company installing the new water line needs to shut down the existing line in order to disconnect it from city service and connect the new line – there are four locations this must be done. We are anticipating this will be an all-day shut down with hopes of it being much shorter. Just as in previous cases, Spellmann, Young, and Harmon will have water and working restrooms.

There will be intermittent shut downs of the heritage side water line for about 10 minutes multiple times throughout the day on Friday, August 3. The company will be doing testing to prepare for the Monday all day shut down.

This should be the last time we have to shut off water for this project. Thank you to everyone for your patience as we complete this much-needed improvement to our campus.



Lisa O'Brien Enger Named Lindenwood Vice President for University Relations

Lindenwood University has announced that St. Louisan Lisa O'Brien Enger will be the university's vice president for university relations. The veteran executive will start in the new position on Sept. 1 and will direct the university's marketing, communication, development, and alumni relations efforts.

O'Brien Enger has more than 20 years of senior leadership and management experience, including executive director

positions at the Clayton Chamber of Commerce, the Susan G. Komen for the Cure St. Louis affiliate, and the United Soybean Board and, most recently, as chief operating officer for the United Soybean Board. She is active in the community, including as a board member of the Cardinal Glennon Children's Hospital Foundation Guild, and received the *St. Louis Business Journal's* 40 under 40 Award in 2008.

Lindenwood University System President Michael D. Shonrock, Ph.D., welcomed O'Brien Enger and lauded her extensive experience.

Facilities Launching New Online Work Order System

The Lindenwood University Facilities Department is implementing a new softwarebased work order reporting system called FAMIS. Dr. Grant Black Named Assistant Director of Hammond Institute



Welcome to Dr. Grant Black, who joined the Hammond Institute for Free Enterprise, as Assistant Director on Wed., August 1.

Prior to joining Lindenwood, Black directed the Center for Entrepreneurship and Economic Education, and was a teaching professor of economics at the University of Missouri-St. Louis. Prior to joining UMSL, he was an associate professor of economics at Indiana University South Bend. In 2002, he was visiting professor at the University of Pretoria in South Africa. Dr. Black has taught both undergraduate and

graduate courses, including introductory macroeconomics; introductory microeconomics; labor economics; energy; economics and the environment; and a survey of economics.

His research focuses on the economics of science and innovation, local and regional economic issues, and economic education. He has contributed to research funded by the Alfred P. Sloan Foundation, the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation, the National Science Foundation, the National Bureau of Economic Research, the South African Revenue Service, and the United States Agency for International Development. He is the author of the book, *The Geography of Small Firm Innovation*, and his research has been the focus of articles in diverse publications, including *Economic Inquiry, Research Policy, Economic Development Quarterly, Science and Public Policy*, and *Growth and Change*. Dr. Black served as a consultant to the Board on Science, Technology and Economic Policy at the National Academy of Sciences and participated in the Scientific Workforce Project sponsored by the National Bureau of Economic Research.

Dr. Black received his undergraduate and master degrees from the University of Missouri-St. Louis (1992, 1994), and his Ph.D. from Georgia State University (2001).



Hammond Institute Holds College Credit Course for High School Students



From July 16 – 27, the Hammond Institute's Justice American Style Program held a course on campus called Justice & the Constitution. This two-week college credit class included 12 high school students (8 students from 7 local high schools and 4 homeschool students). One homeschool student had the following to say about the class: "I've really enjoyed your class and I haven't been this excited about doing schoolwork before in my life. This class

sparked an interest that I didn't know I had, and that's in criminal justice and law enforcement. I want to take more classes that touch on this topic..."

Justice & the Constitution is a unique course taught by Darren Marhanka, associate professor of Criminal Justice, exploring the United States Constitution and its relationship with our current judicial system. The course examines the Constitution and Bill of Rights from the perspective of the application of those rights in criminal and civil cases. Students discuss the application of the First, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, Eighth, and Fourteenth Amendments, as they relate to a current criminal or civil case, and the Supreme Court cases that shape current decisions.
