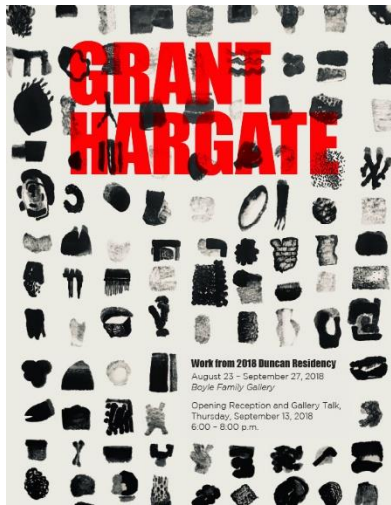

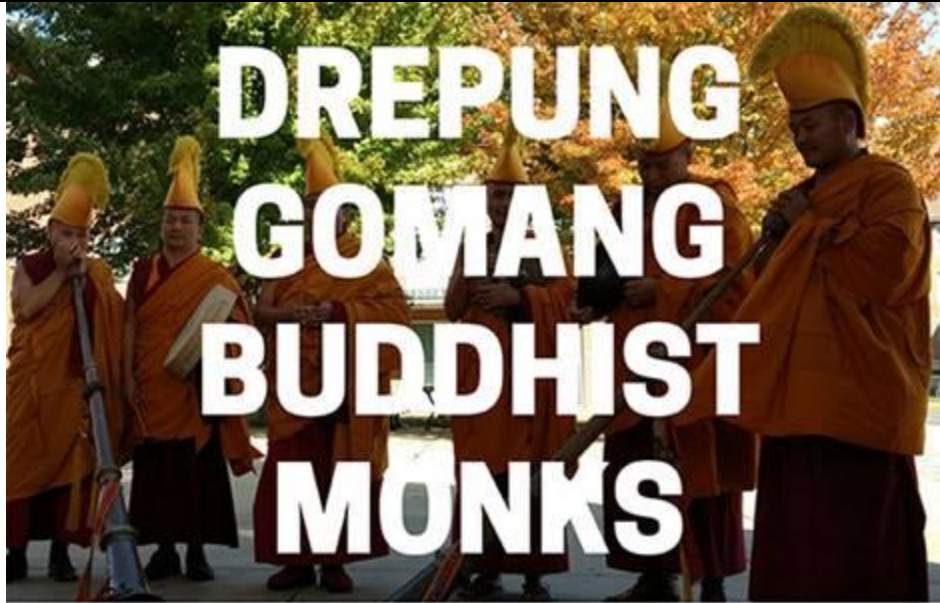
Hargate Residency in Boyle Family Gallery Through Sept. 27
