COLLEGE TO HELP WITH WELDON SPRING ENVIRONMENTAL RESEARCH

The Lindenwood biology department, in cooperation with the college's Office of Research and Planning is developing an environmental research project on Weldon Spring. The project will create an accessible computerized public information base of the existing data on the water and soil content of radionuclides and chemical contaminants within the watersheds surrounding the Weldon Spring chemical plant and the Weldon Spring quarry.

The collection, compilation and collation of data will be supervised by Dr. Rao Ayyagari and Dr. William Tietjen of the biology department, with consultation by Dr. Tom Aley, hydrologist and director of the Ozark Underground Laboratory, Protem, Missouri. Meredith Bollmeier will coordinate the collection of the data and the creation of the information base.

The environmental research project is being coordinated by Dr. James W. Swift, director of the office of research and planning and acting chair of the department of business administration. So far, contributions of \$22,000 have been received toward a \$50,000 budget.
