Women's rugby defeated Life University 36-8 to claim the USA Rugby D1 Elite 15's National Championship Saturday night at Titan Stadium in Fullerton, California. The title is the first 15's championship for the Lady Lions, but second overall for the program after winning the USA Rugby D1 Collegiate Sevens crown last year. Women's Lacrosse Hosts NCAA Midwest Regional



The Lindenwood women's lacrosse team will host the NCAA Division II Midwest Regional this weekend at Hunter Stadium. The first round will take place on Friday when Indianapolis and Regis compete at 5 p.m. The winner will then take on Lindenwood for the regional championship on Saturday at 5 p.m.

Lindenwood enters the national tournament as the No. 1 team in the country. It is the only undefeated team in NCAA Division II with a 19-0 record, and it has won both the RMAC regular season and tournament championships. The Lady Lions defeated Indianapolis by an 11-7 score back in February, and it has two wins over Regis since April 15, including a 19-14 victory last weekend in the RMAC Tournament Championship game.


