# COLLEGE GROUP DISCUSSES USE AND MISUSE OF ALCOHOL ON CAMPUS

Approximately three dozen students and staff members met at the end of the spring semester to discuss the use and misuse of alcohol on campus. Participants expressed concern about the peer pressure frequently associated with drinking and the effects on idividual decisions and group functions.

It was felt that Lindenwood's policy on substance abuse, which includes the responsibility to protect the rights and welfare of all its individuals, would benefit from more active coordination and more visible support. To better accomplish this task, an organization was formed called "PARTY" (Promoting Alcohol Responsibility Through You). The group hopes to: encourage responsible drinking behavior within the campus community; foster an atmosphere of respect for individual choices and plan activities and programs in which alcohol would "complement" rather than "constitute" the fun. The group is not interested in prohibiting drinking.

Twelve PARTY members participated in the recent "live" filming of "Your Alcohol IQ: Celebrities Challenge the Moderation Generation." Sponsored by Anheuser-Busch and starring Michael Tucker and Jill Eikenberry of television's "LA Law," the program provides in an entertaining format information about alcohol use and abuse. Lindenwood student Courtney Austin was highlighted in the question-answer segment. Videos of the production will be available to the public in the fall and will be used in various alcohol education programs on campus. ## HILLMAR BECOMES MEMBER OF UNITED SCENIC ARTISTS UNION

Assistant Professor Gregg Hillmar, scenic designer and technical director in the Performing Arts Department, has been accepted into United Scenic Artists (USA) Local 350, a union representing professional scenic designers and technical artists in the performing arts. USA has jurisdiction in legitimate theatre, motion pictures and television.

Hillmar passed the stringent USA exam, held on June 4 in Chicago, on his first application-a notable accomplishment, as few first-time applicants are accepted, and less than one-half of USA applicants are awarded membership.

His project, an assignment directed by USA, required completion of full blueprints, stage plans and color renderings of the set design for the play "Pygmalion" within a six-week project term.

Hillmar, a professor at Lindenwood since August 1987, has received numerous set and lighting design awards for his work in academic and professional theatre. He and his wife, Caroline, an admissions employee, reside in St. Charles.
