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### A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Returning Student:

Let me begin by saying I am glad you are returning to Lindenwood this Fall. We are looking forward to your arrival in August.

You may think the campus is silent now that you and your fellow students are away for the Summer, but it is a beehive of activity. These next six weeks we have a soccer camp with youngsters of all ages and at other times during the Summer we have conferences of various groups. In addition, our evening classes continue and our day summer school is under way.

The big news is all we are doing to get ready for your return next Fall. You will note elsewhere in this packet of material information about our gift of \$600,000 from Dr. Harlen C. Hunter to refurbish our stadium. We have already let the contract for a new All-Pro synthetic turf just like the turf at Georgia Tech, Florida University and Cornell. Before your return we hope to have walls of the stadium reinforced and new concrete steps in the seating area.

Sometime during the year we plan to construct a softball diamond so our women can compete intercollegiately next Spring. The following year we are planning a baseball team and we'll be building a baseball diamond sometime during the year. These playing surfaces will be located to the west of our newly refurbished Harlen C. Hunter Stadium. We are also in the process of refurbishing the indoor swimming pool in the Basement of Butler Hall. Dorothy Warner, an alumna from Clinton, Illinois, gave us \$25,000 for this purpose. Her gift will enable us not only to refurbish the pool, but to build modern dressing rooms and put a new roof on the gym.

I do hope you are having a pleasant Summer. I really do miss having all the day students on campus and will look forward to your return late in August.

## FUND RAISING FLYS HIGH AS COLLEGE BREAKS \$2 MILLION

If you're walking around the Lindenwood campus and notice some colorful balloons dotting office doors, it's because the College has a lot to celebrate. On June 30, Lindenwood achieved a record high of \$2.1 million in contributions and pledges to its 160th Anniversary Campaign.

Last year's record-setting \$1.6 million was topped this year by an outpouring of generosity by St. Louis corporations, Lindenwood's alumni, the local community and other friends such as Dr. Harlen C. Hunter, who recently gave a \$600,000 gift to renovate and expand the College's stadium and outdoor sports complex.

Some of the highlights of this year's development campaign included a 37% increase in St. Charles community support which can be attributed to the superb efforts of the Lindenwood Board of Overseers and the assistance of Jim Fitz, development chairman, and Jim Maurer, KCLC Advisory Board chairman.

There was also a 42% increase in the corporate division thanks to the efforts of Board of Directors Chairman Robert F. Hyland of CBS Radio, Inc. and Clayton Wilhite, development chairman of the board of directors and chairman of the Lindenwood Business Partnership Campaign.

According to Wilhite, who is the chief executive/managing director of D'Arcy Masius Benton & Bowles, Inc., "The businesses we have approached are responding to the needs of liberal arts education and believe in Lindenwood's vision and ability to produce the leaders of tomorrow."

In addition to Dr. Hunter's gift, which is the second-largest in the college's history, other substantial gifts were received from Southwestern Bell Corporation, who donated \$150,000 to underwrite Lindenwood's new Corporate and Industrial Communications program. Anheuser Busch Company gave \$75,000 and Monsanto Chemical Company contributed \$50,000.

## ACT TESTING

The CAP Center has recently assumed responsibility for administering the ACT test. To be eligible to take the test at Lindenwood a student must meet the following requirements:

1. Be currently enrolled at Lindenwood
2. Be admitted to Lindenwood, or
3. Have completed and turned in an application for admission to Lindenwood

Students are strongly encouraged to take the test at a national test site on one of the scheduled test dates. Lindenwood will only provide this service for students who are unable to meet the national test date schedule. The scores are returned to Lindenwood, not the student, and are retained by the college.

Anyone interested in taking the ACT test at Lindenwood College must contact the CAP Center directly, not via a faculty or staff member, at extension 237. The cost is \$12.50 (checks only) and a **photo ID must be presented on the day of the test.**

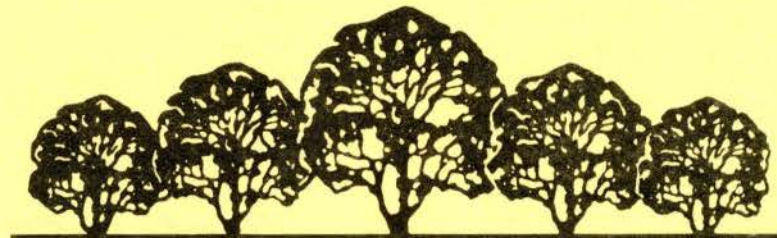
