# EVENING ADMISSIONS SPONSORS FAST-TRACK PROGRAM ORIENTATION

On Thursday, August 25, the Lindenwood College Evening Division will host a free information session to talk about courses of study in the Lindenwood College for Individualized Education (LCIE) fast-track degree programs. The free session will begin at 7 p.m. in Young Science Hall Lounge.

LCIE is a program celebrating its 13th year of providing service to adult students who must choose an alternative to a traditional day college program. In this accelerated learning format, students usually meet for one night per week. The classes, held over an 11-week period, are in the seminar format with an emphasis on writing and class discussions rather than testing. Students may earn nine credit hours per quarter in such undergraduate and graduate programs as: Business Administration, Communications, Profes-Psychology, Valuation sional

Sciences/Appraisal and Human and Organizational Development.

The August orientation session will give an overview of how LCIE works and how programs may be designed to meet individual educational needs. Reservations are requested and may be made by calling 949-2000, Ext. 271.
