## NATIONAL ENDOWMENT FOR THE HUMANITIES

### Summer Stipends:

Will provide \$3,500 for two full and uninterrupted months of study and research. The project "may be completed during the stipend tenure or may be part of a long-range endeavor."

**Application deadline: October 1, 1988**

Notification: Mid-March 1989

### Travel to Collections:

Award of \$750 to be used for research and travel to research collections in libraries, archives, museums and other repositories located throughout the U.S. and the world. May be used to help defray transportation, food and lodging, photo duplication and other research expenses. Funding period begins June 1, 1989.

**Application deadline: January 15, 1989**

Notification: Late May

## NATIONAL SCIENCE FOUNDATION

### Presidential Young Investigator Awards:

Institution may nominate current and prospective faculty members. Individual must have begun first post-Ph.D. tenure track or tenured faculty position after April 30, 1985. Award: Base grant to individual of \$25,000 per year for five years; up to \$37,500 or additional funds per year for five years, on matching basis, to institution.

**Application Deadline: October 1, 1988**

### Visiting Professorships for Women:

To support a woman scientist or engineer doing advanced research at a four-year college or university. In addition to research responsibilities, awardee lectures, counsels and works to increase the visibility of women scientists in academic environment or encourages other women to pursue careers in science and engineering. Provides salary, travel, relocation and research support. Award may be made for periods from 12 to 24 months.
