A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT CONCERNING REQUESTS FOR REPAIRS AND MAINTENANCE

Lindenwood College is blessed with a beautiful campus with old, but attractive buildings. In spite of a limited budget and insufficient personnel, our physical plant employees are doing a good job. However, with the cooperation and understanding of everyone--faculty, students, staff--

they can do a better job.

It is important that we recognize our limitations. We need to remember that the physical plant consists of the following personnel: 5 in construction who do all carpentry, painting, masonary, drywall, etc.; 2 in heating, venting, and air conditioning; 1 electrician; 1 to handle plumbing, locks and the steam plant; 4 for grounds; 1 mechanic; 1 for upholstery and refinishing; 1 inventory clerk; 13 full-time and 2 part-time in custodial; a supervisor and assistant supervisor of custodial personnel; Director of the Physical Plant Bruce Edler and Director of Capital Renovation Jim Moore. This group has 26 buildings and 100 acres of land to tend. Vice President Kenneth Musbach has overall responsibility for all these employees.

For so few employees to handle so many functions requires the patience and cooperation of

everyone.

It will be helpful if everyone follows these procedures:

1) If you need emergency repairs, please call extension 220 and relay the problem to Marge Simlor, physical plant secretary, if Bruce Edler is not available. Ms Simlor will prepare a work order. If the Physical Plant is closed, contact the Security Office, Ext. 242.

2) For routine work orders, please prepare a Requisition Form for the Purchasing Department with account number, date, and description of repairs or service needed and submit to your supervisor for approval. Be sure to type "Physical Plant Work Order" in the top center of the form under "Description of Items."

3) Students who have need of maintenance services in their Residence Hall rooms are to channel their requests to the House Betterment Chair.
