### Council Announces Changes to Employee Tuition Benefit Policy

The following changes in the employee tuition benefit policy have been approved by the President's Council and will become effective July 1, 1989.

1) No employee, spouse or dependent children may receive the tuition benefit until the employee has completed at least six months as a Lindenwood employee.

2) Every employee who opts for a tuition benefit, whether for the employee, spouse, or dependent child, shall pay a surcharge of ten percent (10%) of the total tuition cost, or the actual per capita professor's fee where the course instructor is paid on a per capita basis, plus any course fees.

3) Any non-institutional financial aid received by the person awarded an employee tuition benefit shall

apply toward these surcharges and fees.

4) Under no circumstances can institutionally-funded grants or scholarships be used to pay these surcharges or fees.

5) Employee tuition benefit charges shall be payable

in advance of the beginning of classwork.

6) Any provisions of previous policies that are in conflict with this policy shall be suspended by the provisions of this policy.

7) This policy shall become effective July 1, 1989.
