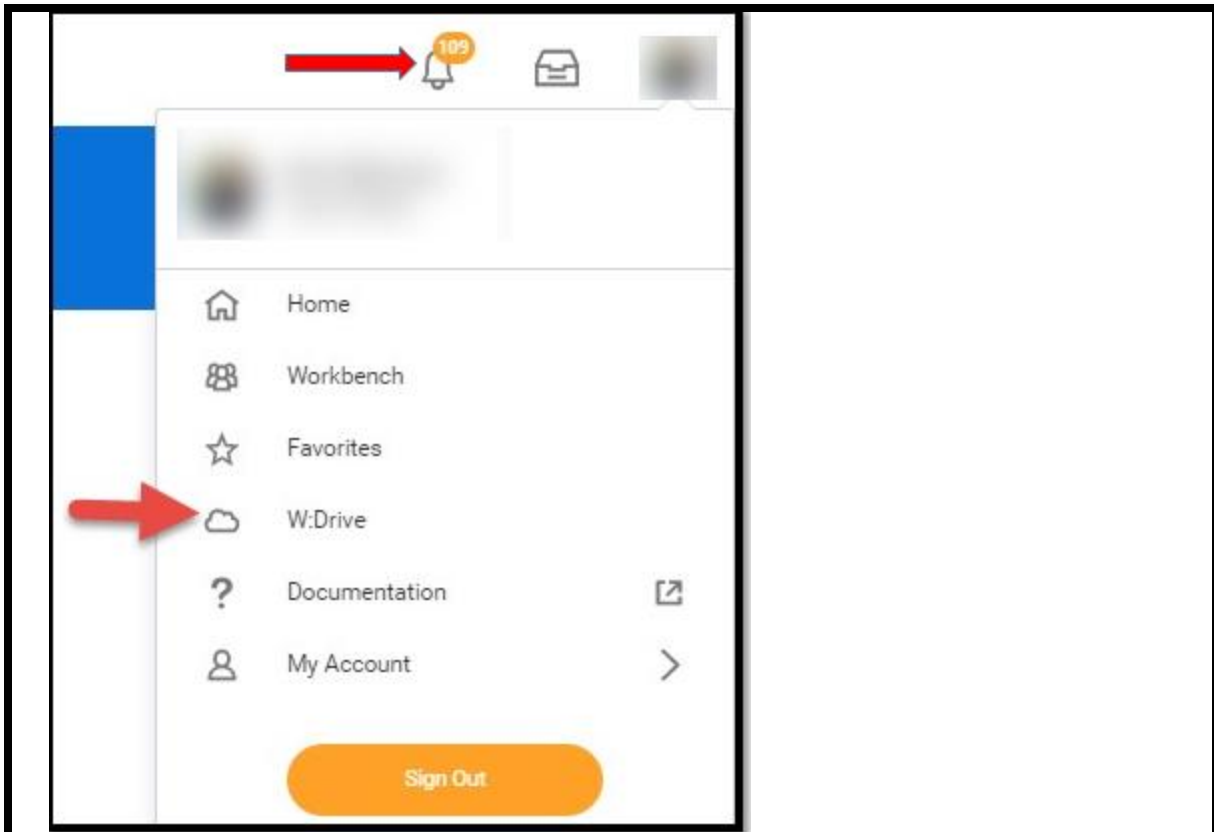
Electronic 1095C Forms Now Available in Workday
