Federation Offers Scholarships for the Blind

Each year at its national convention in July, the National Federation of the Blind gives a broad array of scholarships to legally blind persons pursuing or planning to pursue a full-time post-secondary course of study. Eight different scholarships are available, ranging in awards from \$1,800 to \$10,000. All scholarships are awarded on the basis of academic excellence, service to the community and financial need. Application deadline for all scholarships is March 31 of the year in which the scholarship is to be awarded. Applications are available in the Financial Aid Office.

Missouri Women in Energy Offers Scholarship

Applications are currently available in the Financial Aid Office for three scholarships from the Missouri Women In Energy. Scholarships for \$750, \$500 and \$250 will be awarded to juniors and/or seniors enrolled fulltime in a Missouri college or university majoring in business, education, engineering, home economics, journalism, science or other energy-related field and have an minimum overall GPA of 3.0.

Missouri Women in Energy awards these scholarship each year to students demonstrating achievement, leadership, motivation, professional intent, and scholarship in an energy-related field. Applications must be received by March 1, 1989 and sent to Wanda Eubank, Chair, Missouri Women in Energy Scholarship Committee, 162 Stanley-UMC, Columbia, MO 65211.
