Board Appoints Keck Interim President

The Lindenwood College Board of Directors has announced the appointment of Dr. Daniel N. Keck, as the interim president of the college, effective February 1, 1988. During the transition period between now and February 1, Dr. Keck will serve as acting president of Lindenwood.

Since 1986, Dr. Keck served as the vice president for academic affairs and dean of faculty at the college. In this position, he has had overall responsibility for the college's academic program, student life, admissions and financial aid. In the president's absence, he has had full responsibility for the operation of Lindenwood.

Lindenwood Board of Directors Chairman Robert F. Hyland stated, "Dan Keck is an excellent administrator and we have confidence in his ability to lead the college through this transition." Dr. Keck is also well-respected by the Lindenwood students, faculty and staff.

Prior to his initial appointment at the college, Dr. Keck served as dean of Carthage College in Kenosha, Wisc., where he also taught political science. His teaching and research interests focus on American foreign policy, particularly U.S.-Soviet relations, and he has lectured extensively on international issues.

Commenting on his appointment Dr. Keck said, "I appreciate very much the confidence which this appointment represents and I look forward to working with all of the constituencies of Lindenwood to strengthen this college which means so much to us all."
