"Jack touched many lives during his years at Lindenwood," said Reverend Wilcox. "We were especially concerned that a memorial service be held at a convenient time for all of his students."

Dr. Kirk, an esteemed faculty member at Lindenwood, directed the undergraduate and graduate programs in business administration for the LCIE Program. He taught classes and advised students at Lindenwood for six years prior to his death on November 23, 1988.


