# Lindenwood's NCAA Sports Host 12 Games Throughout The Week

The Lindenwood NCAA athletics program will host 12 games on campus throughout this week. Half of those games will be from the softball team. The Lady Lions enter the week at .500 on the season, and will have a non-conference doubleheader on Tuesday versus Saint Louis College of Pharmacy (2 p.m.). Over the weekend, Lindenwood starts conference play with a Friday doubleheader versus Missouri Western (2 p.m.) and a Saturday twinbill against Northwest Missouri (12 p.m.).



The women's lacrosse team, ranked third in the nation, has its conference opener on Wednesday night with a 7 p.m. game at Hunter Stadium versus Fort Lewis. The men's lacrosse has a top-15 showdown on Saturday afternoon at noon. The Lions will be taking on last year's NCAA Champions, Limestone.

The men's volleyball squad goes out of conference on Friday night with a 7 p.m. game against Saint Francis. The Lions are looking to avenge a five-set loss last year to the Red Flash.



The tennis programs have three matches at the Lindenwood Tennis Courts this week. On Tuesday, the men's team has a 12 p.m. match with Maryville. Saturday, both the men's and women's teams have a MIAA match against Southwest Baptist at 1 p.m.
