
#### Strategic Plan Page Now Live on Lindenwood Website

#### Becker to Present "The FBI in Latin America" on March 27

The History and Georgraphy department presents "<u>The FBI in Latin America</u>" as presented by Dr. Marc Becker, professor of history at Truman State University, March 27 from 4-5 p.m. in Dunseth Auditorium at Harmon Hall.

Becker is the Latin American historian at Truman State University. He has traveled extensively throughout Latin America and the Caribbean, and his research has been funded by the Fulbright Program, the Social Science Research Council, the American Historical Association among others. He has written or edited eleven books in English and two in Spanish. His most recent book, *The FBI in Latin America* (Duke University Press, 2017) examines the FBI's role in Ecuador in the 1940s when it used World War II-era anti-fascism to prevent the spread of communism after 1943. It serves as a window into U.S. foreign policy and the political left in Ecuador and Latin America more broadly.

#### Afful Presents at Cor Jesu Academy



Dr. Stephanie Afful, associate professor of psychology, gave a diversity and inclusion keynote address at Cor Jesu Academy on March 6 called "Taking off the blindfold and unpacking the backpack: A story of privilege" to approximately 600 students, faculty, and parents.

Afful has a background in social psychology, specifically modern measurements of racism, racial identity, and interracial relations. She was invited to speak after serving as a consultant last year on

increasing diversity programming at the school.
