## President's Council Repeals Tuition Benefit Policy Changes

The Lindenwood College President's Council has announced that the Employee Tuition Benefits Policy changes previously approved at the Council's June 9, 1988 meeting have been repealed. Specific provisions repealed include the proposed 10% surcharge on all tuition charges and the six month waiting period before employees, their spouses and dependents would become eligible for these tuition benefits. These provisions were scheduled to go into effect July 1, 1989. The 14-member council agreed that rescinding these changes would be in the best interests of the college and its employees.

An additional change was made which would amend Page 8, Paragraph 6 in the Employee Handbook to read:

"Dependent children of all full-time employees who desire to attend other accredited, private or public colleges or universities may receive a \$1,000 stipend per year, applicable to full-time tuition or room and board costs. Stipends are paid in two annual installments of \$500, and are subject to a maximum of \$4,000 during a four-year period as long as the child maintains full-time academic status."

(Changes in the current tuition benefits policy are underlined above for your convenience.)

The change will become effective as of January 1, 1989 and will apply to dependent children's enrollment after that date.

Also, the Council agreed that non-institutional financial aid received by the person awarded an employee tuition benefit shall still apply toward the tuition waiver benefit.

### Bornmann Publishes Research On Resin

Dr. John Bornmann, Lindenwood chemistry professor, reports that he co-authored the paper, "Solvent-Induced Crystallinity in Thermoplastic Resin Systems," which was recently presented at a Gordon Research Conference on Composites in Ventura, Calif. Bornmann said C.J. Wolf, M.A. Grayson and he combined efforts for an on-going research project at McDonnell Douglas. They examined the properties of a plastic which Bornmann said is likely to replace the present epoxy plastic used by major aerospace companies in the U.S.

"The importance of plastics in aerospace is best demonstrated by the fact that McDonnell Douglas' AV 8-B Harrier jump-jet contains 35% plastic material," said Bornmann. He explained that the Harrier, a vertical take-off and landing aircraft, was originally designed by the British. Bornmann said McDonnell Douglas' inclusion of plastic has greatly increased the Harrier's range to make it effective for combat.

"The use of plastics on commercial aircraft," stated Bornmann, "permits the plane to carry less fuel, more passengers or more electronic safety equipment." Bornmann said the first and last of these options are important improvements.
