Eastern Michigan University is sponsoring three programs for college credit during the summer term and the fall semester. Summer programs in cultural history offer guided tours and lectures by professors in art, history, literature, and political science. The European summer program includes visits to London, Paris, East and West Berlin, Prague, Vienna, Salzburg, Munich, Venice, Florence, Pisa, Rome and Pompeii. The final discussion in this series will be held on March 15. Moderated by Dr. Richard Wier and Dr. Alan Meyers, the main topic will focus on Bloom's philosophical, political and religious background of argument.

## Presbyterian Scholarship Available For Christian Education Studies

Nominations are now being accepted for the Presbyterian Scholarship at the Presbyterian School of Christian Education for students enrolled as a junior in the Master of Arts program. The scholarship is aimed at encouraging gifted students to consider preparation for the Christian education ministry and providing more skilled leadership for the educational ministry of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). Full tuition scholarships will be offered for the 1989-90 academic year. Nominees must:

- hold membership in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.)
- complete undergraduate degree requirements in any field at a four-year Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) college or university
- demonstrate superior academic achievement
- show promise of effective leadership in the church.

Scholarship nominations can be made by a faculty member or campus minister of the four-year Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) college or university. These nominations must be endorsed by the president or dean of faculty of the institution and should be sent to the Presbyterian School of Christian Education by March 15. Award recipients and their schools will be notified no later than April 15.

To receive the award, the nominee must have completed the regular admissions process at the Presbyterian School of Christian Education and have been accepted and enrolled as a full-time student for the coming academic year. The funds will be deposited directly to the student's account to cover tuition costs at the school. (Submitted by Dr. Allen Schwab, Undergraduate Dean.)
