The Lindenwood women's lacrosse team is currently 11-0 on the season and ranked third in the nation. They will be in action Saturday afternoon with a 1 p.m. game against Rockhurst. The Lady Lions will be looking to hit a major milestone in that contest. Since moving to the NCAA level, Lindenwood is 49-0 in conference games, and a win on Saturday would be the team's 50th straight conference win. The Lady Lions are 4-0 all-time against Rockhurst and have only allowed four goals in those contests.
