

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

#### NOTES FROM THE DIRECTOR

Mort Shuman and Eric Blau translated 30 Jacques Brel songs into English initially out of a commitment to introduce the popular French songs to an American audience. The idea of developing a musical review grew as the translation evolved.

JACQUES BREL IS could be called the first librettoless musical. The formal concept of the work was simply to use songs as the total text of the play and hopefully, to end with the same sense of fulfillment that a wellmade drama should have. That is, to engage involve, and reveal something to an audience about itself and how it relates to others outside that funny space - time discontinuum we call the theatre.

Jacques Brel born in 1929, died in 1978. The legacy of his music remains.

The continued popularity of the musical JACQUES BREL IS is a testimonial to the universibility and dynamics of the songs and their themes.


#### GUEST ARTISTS
