that we do not intend publishing, ir this paper, any of the electioneering cir culars of the candidates, at length, gra tuitously, unless handbills of the same are engaged."

We have perused Mr. Sibley's address, and are much pleased with it-His views on every point, entirely coincide with our awa But for the rule laid down for our go vernment, it would afford us pleasure to comply with the request of Mr. Sib
