Please join the marrow registry! It is free, you just need to provide your info, they mail you a cheek swab, and you mail it back in a pre-paid envelope. You could help to save someone's life, including Travis' life. https://bethematch.org/ #LionsSupportLions



Lindenwood Swim & Dive would like to ask you to join the <u>Be The Match</u> registry & take the first step to being the cure for patients with blood cancers like Leukemia. It is also a commitment to take the next step if a patient needs you to donate your cells for a life-saving bone marrow transplant.

Joining the registry requires a sample of cells, usually collected by swabbing the inside of your cheek. This sample will be compared to specific protein markers, known as human leukocyte antigens (HLA) with HLA markers of patients who need a bone marrow transplant.

You can also donate financially and help to deliver cures to blood cancer patients. Every \$100 raised adds potential marrow donors to the Be The Match Registry, helps more patients afford transplant and funds life-saving research.

Travis Russo dove for Lindenwood this past season & his leukemia has recently returned. He played a key role in the growth and development of the men's diving program and we are excited to support Travis and encourage the Lindenwood Community to do so as well.
