Nick Feakes has been nominated for the 2017-18 Scholz Award.

The senior flyhalf is one of 12 players nominated for the honor, which recognizes the best men's D1 college player of the season. It was first awarded

in the 2015-16 season and is named after Rudy Scholz, a standout for Santa Clara who won two Olympic gold medals in rugby in 1920 and 1924. Dylan Audsley of Saint Mary's won in 2016, and Bryce Campbell from the University of Indiana won in 2017.

#### **Social Work Hosts Empty Bowls**

On April 3, Social Work students and faculty hosted an Empty Bowls event to raise

awareness of food insecurity and hunger. The Empty Bowls Project is a grassroots movement to help end hunger. It has grown into an international movement, raising awareness and money to help those in need. Its concept is simple: potters and other craftsmen (for our event the Lindenwood art students and faculty) create hand crafted bowls. A meal of broth and bread donated by Pedestal Foods, similar to a soup kitchen dinner, was offered as a "thank you" for donating to the cause of local hunger relief. The handmade bowls serve as a reminder of all of the empty bowls in the world. The event raised \$700 for Food Outreach, a fresh food serving agency for those St. Louis metropolitan region residents living in poverty and diagnosed with cancer or HIV.
