Dr. McCluer Returns From Extended Tour Of United States

Dr. and Mrs. McCluer have just returned from a brief six months tour of the United States. While on their visit they attended the inauguration of 26 governors, visited friends in Washington, D. C., spent several weeks in Florida, visited Bryn Mawr, Vassar, Stephens, William Woods and Wellesley, and promoted alumni clubs at Harvard, Yale, Westminster, Rolla, and all other schools where he found a large gathering of Lindenwood graduates.

Commenting on his return Dr. McCluer murmured, "It's really wonderful to get back to our home again. We missed the girls so much during our six months absence, and it gives us such a thrill to be back here on the Smith campus."

"Nothing can stop the Army Air Corps . . . except the Navy!" Flash . . . big clash! Early this morning Dr. Franc L. McCluer revealed a communique from Washington, D. C. announcing the victory of the Navy over the Army Air Corps in the struggle for military priority to establish a base on the Lindenwood campus. Supremacy of the Navy over the Air Corps was attributed to the presence of Lake Success.

The boys in blue will anchor in the new dorm which will be named "It Can Happen Here" dorm. It will be fully equipped for their living quarters. Bars will be put over the portholes windows (to insure non-entrance of L. C. students, that is, but not to keep the sailors in). In the recreation room there will be facilities for pool, movies, dancing (with a name band every month), all variety of sports and a special room set aside for pinups. Special date parlors will be installed on first floor off the main parlor, each equipped with a radio and proper lighting for correct navy maneuvers. Any girls who know of sailors they wish to attend Lindenwood should hand in their names to Mr. Motley immediately. These men will be given top priority.

With the advent of men on the campus, the Student Council has released a new set of rules by which the Lindenwood Student Body is to govern itself.

- All dates shall return to the campus by 4 a. m., and must be in the dormitories by 7 a. m. in order to get ready for 8 classes.
- Students are asked to report any lights still burning on the campus grounds after 10 p. m. Lights, especially around the swings will not be tolerated.
- Girls are requested to refrain from singing any armed forces songs except "Anchors Aweigh." Remember it is a breach of etiquette if you do not raise your glasses while singing this.
- Girls are requested to sunbathe only on the roof of "It Has Happened Here" dorm.

- A required course for all students will be "Learn the Navy Way." This course in sailing will be taught by the Navy men on the campus. Each student must have her own individual instructor.
