Ozark School District MA Program Graduates



Dr. Joyce Piveral, dean of the Lindenwood University School of Education, and Director of Extended Sites Christine Lindquist attended the graduation of the Ozark School District Master of Arts program in Ozark, Mo. on Aug. 9. Teachers from Ozark School District earn college

credit from Lindenwood as part of a special program.

The MA program was designed specifically to address the instructional needs of the Ozark School District and is only available to district educators. Ozark School District pays for a cohort of 20 teachers to participate in the program. District teachers must apply and be accepted to both the district cohort and Lindenwood University. Classes are taught by district educators to



ensure consistency and continuity with the district's mission and goals. Graduates of the program then become teachers of teachers, presenting at professional development days and building faculty meetings.

Volunteers Needed for "Book Brigade" Event Aug. 24

To cover the distance between the buildings, approximately 350-400 volunteers are needed.


