

GUEST ARTISTS

Yvonne Ghareeb (Guest Director) resides in Brooklyn, New York, where she free lances as a director. She has been company manager and director for SUMMERSTAGE for two years. Yvonne taught at Lindenwood Colleges for two years as well as directed many of their productions. She was theatre manager for the Direct Theatre in New York where she coordinated two Directors' Festivals and an Actors' Festival in addition to managing personnel, scheduling and classes. For four years she was artistic and managing director of the Continental Theatre Company, directing some twenty shows. Prior to that, she taught and developed a curriculum in Speech/Theatre at the J. S. Morton High School in Cicero, Illinois. Recently she has directed Last of the Red Hot Lovers at Noah's Ark Dinner Theatre, Vanities at Lindenwood Colleges and The Little Foxes at Theatre Project.

Charles Leader (Boo Radley) is a professional actor from Los Angeles. Leader, a favorite with St. Charles audiences has appeared frequently on the Lindenwood stage. He portrayed Charles Dickens in the 1977 and 1978 productions of *A Christmas Carol* as well as appearing in the SUMMERSTAGE productions of *Godspell* and as Charlie in *You're A Good Man Charlie Brown*. Leader studied acting at the University of Denver, Kansas State University and in New York. He toured with the Continental Theatre Company for seven years. This year he played Paul in *Carnival* and Scrooge in *A Christmas Carol*. He recently played Dick in *Play It Again*, *Sam* at Noah's Ark Dinner Theatre.

James Paul (Atticus Finch) appeared as Mr. Frank in last year's production of *The Diary of Anne Frank*. Among his numerous stage credits, encompassing theatre in New York City, and dinner theatre in Ohio, Wisconsin, Illinois and Missouri, he lists such representative roles as Duncan in *MacBeth*, Talthybias in *The Trojan Women*, the Actor in Gorki's *The Lower Depths* and Torvald in *A Doll's House*. Jim has also performed with the *Muny Opera* in St. Louis, as Baptista in *Kiss Me Kate*, Old Iron Belly, in *South Pacific*, Grandfather in *Oliver* with Vincent Price and Karpathy in *My Fair Lady*. Jim is also talented as a director, and finds time to teach at Nerinx Hall in Webster Groves. This past summer he appeared in the SUMMERSTAGE productions of 1776 and *Good Doctor*.




